***Strengths:***

The College was established in 1971 and since then has shown consistent growth in quality education. Along with the conventional Arts, Commerce and Science stream the college also offers skill based courses. The college tries to promote the research culture among the faculty members which resulted in publishing 29 research papers. Smart classrooms are made available for students.

The college has active mentor-mentee scheme to address the academic as well as socio-psychological needs of the mentee. The NSS unit organized various extension activities such as Yoga Shibir, Cleaning Camp, Voter day and Tree Plantation Programme. The Central library of the college has good number of subscription and it is fully automated. The college has successfully worked towards gender equity promotion and sensitivity by organizing many programs and activities. A good contribution has been made by the Alumni Association.

***Weaknesses:***

Full time counselling for competitive exams is not available. Only one research center is available. No research center for Arts and Commerce students.

***Opportunities:***

MoUs for student placement interdisciplinary research

***Challenges:***

Being rural area the college has great challenge in fulfilling the enrolments of students for various programmes. It's more challenging to train students in modern fields of science.


Students competency in communication is low.

**Section IV: Recommendations for Quality Enhancement of the College**


1. The College must establish collaborations and linkages with industries and reputed institutions

We have gone through the observations and Recommendations in this report made by the AAA Expert team for Quality Enhancement of the College. We agree to aforesaid observations and recommendations.





