7.3 Give two Best Practices of the Institution

(a) Title of the practice-

I) Lab Technician Course under Community College Scheme of the UGC.

Context- Education should inculcate the competencies and skills that are essential in today's job markets and thereby generate the sources of employment

Goals –. The main objectives of the scheme are:

- (i) to make higher education relevant to the learner and the community;
- (ii) to integrate relevant skills into the higher education system;
- (iii) to provide skill based education to students currently pursuing higher education but actually interested in entering the workforce at the earliest opportunity;
- (iv) to provide employable and certifiable skills based on National Occupational Standards (NOSs) with necessary general education to Senior Secondary School pass-outs, with general education and /or vocational education background.
- (v) to provide for up-gradation and certification of traditional / acquired skills of the learners irrespective of their age;
- (vi) to provide opportunities for community–based life-long learning by offering courses of general interest to the community for personal development and interest;
- (vii) to provide opportunity for vertical mobility to move to higher education in future;
- (viii) to offer bridge courses to certificate holders of general / vocational education, so as to bring them at par with appropriate NSQF level.
- (ix) to provide entrepreneurial orientation along with required skill training for selfemployment and entrepreneurship development.

The proposed course under Community College reflects the regional needs. The academic syllabi often do not give autonomy to the students and teachers and often fail to address the regional needs. The proposed course will relate education to the professional and more competitive fields and domains. They would certainly make the students more employable and open up new avenues in job-market. By implementing the scheme of "Community College" the college can significantly contribute to the socioeconomic development of the region. The proposed course will create skilled human resource which is required in Healthcare Sector. Under the proposed work, the Hospitals & Pathology labs (collaborating partners) will avail expertise to counsel the students. It would certainly enhance student knowledge and skills.

Target groups-

- i) The students who are eligible for but not directly a part of mainstream higher education due to socioeconomic problems.
- ii) The students who have temporarily dropped out of higher education due to failure in the examinations.
- iii) The individuals who possess basic qualifications and skills and are willing to be self-reliant.

Outcome of the Scheme

Fifty students have enrolled for Medical Lab Technician Course. The college has availed expertise and infrastructure to effectively run the course. The regional needs of the students are addressed through the course.

Expected outcome

After completion of the course 50 enrolled students will be self-reliant and self-employed.

II) Title of the Practice- BCUD sponsored National Seminar on "Genres of Marathi Literature"

1) The Context - Marathi literature is introduced right from the primary level of education. Yet students fail to grasp the ways of understanding, interpreting and analysing different genres at the undergraduate and the postgraduate levels. The seminar focussed structure of genres and the different techniques of teaching genres

2) Goals

- i) To familiarize the students with the theory of different genres of Marathi Literature
- ii) To discuss the techniques of teaching genres at the undergraduate and the postgraduate levels.
- iii) To explore possibilities of further research.

3) Outcome of the Seminar

The selected papers were published in a book form with an ISBN.

- 6) Two batches of A Ten-day Soft Skills Development Programme were conducted for the third year students of all faculties of the College. Eighty students derived benefit of the courses.
- 7) Lectures of experts in different academic disciplines were organized.
- 8) The college facilitated higher education to 375 students through distance education centre of Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University (YCMOU), Nashik.
- 9) The Social Sciences Association conducted a poster competition and an essay-writing competition on *Rasta Suraksha Abhiyan*. The Association held a workshop on career guidance through MAT Foundation Nashik. It also invited experts from Vasundhara Foundation, Nashik to acquaint the students with Stock Exchanges and other modes of Investment. - (a) 1) Title of the Practice- UGC sponsored National Seminar on "Contribution of Marathi Journals and Magazines to Genres of Marathi Literature"
 - 2) Goals
 - i) To familiarize the students with the types of Marathi journals and magazines.
 - ii) To discuss their contribution to analysis and understanding of Marathi Genres.
 - iii) To explore possibilities of further research.
 - 3) The Context Marathi journals and magazines have heritage of almost one hundred and seventy years. Most of the popular journals and magazines have maintained multidisciplinary spirit and pursuits. Even the journals and magazines devoted to social sciences have given ample scope to literatures. The forms of poetry, novel and short story are popular with the Marathi journals and magazines. Journals and magazines have given a literary identity to many writers. The seminar has thrown light upon the significance of journals and magazines in enhancing literary sensibilities and promoting literary criticism.
 - 4) Output of the Seminar- The seminar gave an opportunity of interacting with eminent writers and critics like Vasant Abaji Dahake, Mangesh Kale, Vidya Deodhar, Prabhakar Desai, Prithviraj Taur, Mrinalini Kamat and Bhalchandra Shinde. Eighty six teachers from Maharashtra, Gujrat and Karnatak participated in the seminar. The research papers were published in the form of a reference book with an ISBN.

(b) Title of the practice-

Lab Technician Course under Community College Scheme of the UGC.

Goal –. The main objectives of the scheme are:

- (i) to make higher education relevant to the learner and the community;
- (ii) to integrate relevant skills into the higher education system;
- (iii) to provide skill based education to students currently pursuing higher education but actually interested in entering the workforce at the earliest opportunity;
- (iv) to provide employable and certifiable skills based on National Occupational Standards (NOSs) with necessary general education to Senior Secondary School passouts, with general education and /or vocational education background.
- (v) to provide for up-gradation and certification of traditional / acquired skills of the learners irrespective of their age;
- (vi) to provide opportunities for community—based life-long learning by offering courses of general interest to the community for personal development and interest;
- (vii) to provide opportunity for vertical mobility to move to higher education in future;
- (viii) to offer bridge courses to certificate holders of general / vocational education, so as to bring them at par with appropriate NSQF level.
- (ix) to provide entrepreneurial orientation along with required skill training for self-employment and entrepreneurship development.

The proposed course under Community College reflects the regional needs. The academic syllabi often do not give autonomy to the students and teachers and often fail to address the regional needs. The proposed course will relate education to the professional and more competitive fields and domains. They would certainly make the students more employable and open up new avenues in job-market. By implementing the scheme of "Community College" the college can significantly contribute to the socioeconomic development of the region. The proposed course will create skilled human resource which is required in Healthcare Sector. Under the proposed work, the Hospitals & Pathology labs (collaborating partners) will avail expertise to counsel the students. It would certainly enhance student knowledge and skills.

- (1) A course on "Environment Awareness" is introduced at second year level in Arts, Commerce and Science faculties.
- (2) An excursion to Ralegan Siddhi (the village where noted social activist Anna Hazare undertook social development programmes) and Nighoj was organized. The participants

studied conservation of natural resources in Ralegan Siddhi. They also observed the potholes in Nighoj.

Strengths of the college

The college is the only institute in Chandwad Tehsil that imparts higher education. From the year 2009-10, Science faculty was introduced and it was given 100% grant – in – aid status by government of Maharashtra in 2012-13.

This has opened up new avenues of research. The college has established linkage with University of Nigeria in the area of nano-technology. It would further research activities and research culture. With the assistance of Piramal Group of Companies the college has set up well-equipped research labs in the campus of the mother institute. Of late, teachers are engaged in research leading to Ph.D. There is increase in the number of teachers, presenting papers at national and international conferences. More teachers are inclined towards research projects. Four teachers until now have written reference books. Principal Dr G H Jain is a research guide in physics and Dr Suresh Patil and Dr T Y Chadwadkar have applied for recognition as the research guides. At present almost 90% of the permanent teaching faculty are working on minor research projects. Dr T Y Chandwadkar has to his credit a UGC funded major research project on Legends in Marathi Literature. Dr G H Jain, Dr S D Shinde and Dr G E Patil have participated in International Conferences held abroad. Under Community College Scheme of UGC (XII th Plan), the College is sanctioned DMLT course. The College has made efforts to inculcate research attitude among the students. Students have been encouraged to participate in Avishkar Research Festival. Every year annual magazine devoted to a specific theme is published. Its 2014-15 issue was awarded second prize by SPPU, Pune.

The college at present avails more options at UG and PG levels in all faculties to bring in academic flexibility.

The college has a strong N.S.S. unit with 250 volunteers. It maintains rapport with governmental and non-governmental agencies. The activities directed at social development are regularly organized. The volunteers participate in social, cultural, programmes organized by Pune University and State and Central governments. The N.S.S. unit has been awarded three times until now by SPPU, Pune. It has been involved in Tree Plantation Programmes, Blood Donation Camps and constructing roads and check dams in the villages around Chandwad.

There is a considerable improvement in participation of students in sports at inter-group and inter-university tournaments. In the year 2015-16, Jalinder Ahire participated in National Level Boxing Tournament held at Indore. As a social initiative the College has provided gyms in the three neighbouring villages.

The percentage of girl-students is around 50%. This ensures gender- equity. Job oriented courses in handicrafts, beauty-parlour, toy-making and dress designing are facilitated for girl – students and women in the town.

Weaknesses of the college.

Students are weak in communication skills. Their competence in English language is not satisfactory. The stakeholders are not adequately trained in the use of information and communication technology. There is a lack of linkages with job-providing agencies. The college has not initiated scholarships and financial aids to the students on a broader scale through its own resources.

• Opportunities.

- (I) Management is dedicated and pro-active
- (II) Students are disciplined.
- (III) Overall environment is conducive to development
- (IV) Staff is well qualified and competent. College has appointed the competent faculty to teach the UG and PG courses which are run on the financial resources of the institute itself.

Context:

Materials are essential for the economic growth of any country. They provide support to the down-stream industries and the entire industrial development of the nation. Maximization of the use of materials would result in an increase of the added value as new products could be obtained from the materials and its processing intermediates. During the last two decades, new technologies have been developed in the areas of material processing which allow its utilization in advanced applications.

However, the intermediates require further purification to produce advanced materials for advanced industrial applications. Scientific collaboration among scientists from a variety of disciplines can help in better understanding of the material processing and utilization. R&D should focus on developing cost effective techniques to develop and utilize materials for solving the problems facing the world during the new millennium such as energy, environment, climate change, food and water supply.

In this regard, the National Conference on Nanomaterial Imperatives in the New Millennium (MINM 2017) was organized by the Department of Physics to share experience and exchange views between academicians, researchers and scientists all over India.

Output

This conference provided a good chance for participants to discuss and present the recent advances in synthesis and processing technologies of nano materials and their subsequent manufacturing for production of ready-to-use products.

The conference provided also an excellent opportunity for interaction and networking among participants for future collaboration with CMET, NCL and other research institutes.

C) National Meet of Marathi Arthshastra Parishad

Marathi Arthshastra Parishad is one of the prominent bodies in Maharashtra that promotes research in Economics. It publishes a trimonthly "Arthsanwad" which is a quality journal in Marathi devoted economic issues. Eminent economists – Dr V M Dandekar, Dr N V Sovani, Dr Yashwant Raravikar and Dr Ashutosh Raravikar have contributed to Marathi Arthshastra Parishad. Every year Marathi Arthshastra Parishad organizes a meet of its registered members.

Aims and objectives of the Meet

- i) To discuss drought situation in Maharashtra and to suggest remedies to overcome the drought situation
- ii) To discuss the impact of economic reforms on Indian agriculture

Context

Recurring droughts have posed a big economic challenge to Maharashtra in the recent decades. They have affected the productivity of agriculture. Further erroneous systems of marketing aggravate the conditions of Indian farmers. They are often pressurized by loans and tend to commit suicide. Maharashtra has witnessed maximum number of farmers' suicides. The post-globalization economic

reforms have not given justice to the agricultural sector. The share of agriculture in GDP has drastically fallen. The Meet made a serious effort to address these contemporary issues

Output

The Meet provided academicians and researchers a platform to address to the issues of agriculture, droughts, conservation of water resources and equitable distribution of economic resources.

The papers presented in the meet were published in the form of a journal "Arthnemi'

Strengths of the college

The college is the only institute in Chandwad Tehsil that imparts higher education. In the last two years the college has introduced postgraduate courses in Commerce, Politics, History, English, Mathematics, Chemistry, Botany and Physics. At graduate level Geography is also introduced as a special subject. Elective option of Auditing and Taxation as a special subject is availed to the students of Commerce at graduate level. The PG students of Chemistry have got placement in a Delhi based multinational chemicals' company. The college has developed infrastructure for research in sciences with the assistance of Piramal Industries Limited. Through NSS, the College has been maintaining a strong link with the society. The DMLT course under Community College Scheme of the UGC has given the students the source of earning livelihood. To run self-funded PG courses the college has appointed well qualified teaching faculty. CO-curricular and extra-curricular activities are organized on a broader scale to develop competencies among the students. The College hosted Selection Tests for Youth Festival, Avishkar Research Festivals, Intergroup Sports Tournaments and State and National level conferences.

Weaknesses of the college.

Chandwad is not given the facility of a bus depot. Therefore means of transportation are limited. The students are weak in communication skills. Their competence in English language is not satisfactory. The stakeholders are not adequately trained in the use of information and communication technology. There is a lack of linkages with job-providing agencies. The college has not initiated

scholarships and financial aids to the students on a broader scale through its own resources.

Opportunities.

- (I) Management is dedicated and pro-active
- (II) Students are disciplined.
- (III) Overall environment is conducive to development
- (IV) Even to teach self-financed PG Courses, well qualified and competent staff is appointed..
- (V) More Programs aimed at empowerment of women could be initiated.
- (VI) Collaborations can be formed to help students prepare for competitive examinations. This would add to the value of education.
- VII) Budgetary provision for research may be enhanced.
- (VIII) Financial aids can be provided through the resources of the college or resources of the mother-institute.

Threats / Challenges

- (I) Dropout rate.
- (II) Lack of facilities of transportation discourage students' involvement in the academic activities that are conducted offer college hours.
- (III) Inadequate infrastructure for sports (400 meter track is not availed)
- (IV) Lack of funds (as non-salary grants) pressurize the resources of the College
- (V) The expenses on P.G courses are borne by the college.

Best Practices of the College in 2017-18

1. Title of the Practice - Summer Special Water Conservation Camp at Urdhul, Chandwad

Goals- i) To suggest ways of overcoming drought

- ii) To create awareness of conservation of water among the villagers.
- iii) To demonstrate dignity of labor
- iv) To strengthen College- society link

Context – Recurrent droughts have often affected socioeconomic conditions of agriculture-dependent population of Maharashtra. The oddities in distribution of seasonal rains demoralize the farmers. The faulty practices of marketing aggravate the situation further resulting into suicides of the farmers. At this juncture the generation and conservation of water resources are highly recommended. Keeping in this view Pani Foundation and Savitribai Phule Pune University appealed 10 colleges to undertake water conservation initiatives at the specified villages with people's participation in May 2018.

Output of the Summer Special Camp

Despite the period of vacation one hundred students participated in the camp.

Four low boulder structures were constructed at Urdhul.

The students removed mud from a small pond.

The work of compartment bunding was also done.

The estimated cost of these works would be about Rs 17 lakh.

To inculcate the spirit of social responsibility a lecture series was conducted.

2. Title of the Practice- Use of Android Note cam App for the Geographical Location of the field by M.Sc. Botany Staff & Students:

Goals- i) To collect the specimens for academic and research work

- ii) To locate the geographical spot of the plant
- iii) To keep the record of the specimens (Time, Date, Altitude, Longitude etc.)

Context – Notecam is an application of android mobile. It is used to take photograph. It can be widely applied in taxonomy during field visits. If we take photograph of a particular species on field, notecam can give details of exact location of the species (Date, latitude, longitude, altitude etc).

Output- Notecam is used by the faculty as well as the students of botany during field visits. The locations of more than 250 species around Chandwad have been recorded by notecam camera.
